

Choose Natural Gas

Delivering Natural Gas to Warburton



The Warburton Gas project is a State Government funded project to deliver natural gas to Warburton. The project involves extending the existing main gas line approximately 3.5km from Millgrove to Warburton and installing a network of distribution pipes throughout the Warburton Township.

Update

To date, we have installed nearly 80% of gas pipes in the Warburton Township. While a large proportion of the distribution network is installed, we will start to commission the local street network in areas that have been completed and as we finish work in an area. The map (back of this update) indicates when gas will be progressively made available in your area (note this is subject to change)

Now accepting connections to natural gas via your gas retailer

Multinet gas is now ready to accept gas connections (Easy steps to connect)

1. Check the map to see if natural gas will be available in your street and location (back of this newsletter or visit www.multinetgas.com.au). If not see gas not in your street below.
2. Apply to an energy retailer for a gas service and retailer supply contract (there are a number of current gas retailers - refer to yourchoice.vic.gov.au for up to gas date retailers). Your energy retailer will coordinate with Multinet Gas to install the gas service to your property.
3. You will need to arrange a gas fitter to assess the proposed gas appliances and installation of gas fitting lines in your property.
4. Your gas fitter will then coordinate with your energy retailer to arrange for the installation of the meter and arrange final connection.
5. Once this is all completed and gas is connected, you can then apply for the incentive rebate from Multinet Gas by completing the rebate form (refer to www.multinetgas.com.au).

Gas not in your street

Unfortunately some parts of Warburton have not been included in the project scope. If your property falls in this category you can still apply for a gas connection through a gas retailer. Multinet Gas will assess the costs in accordance with the Gas Distribution Code. It may be beneficial to make a group application to one gas retailer to make it more economically viable. Your gas retailer will inform you if any shortfall costs apply.

Connections incentives

Multinet Gas will be offering rebates to the first 500 customers that connect to natural gas and will be available to be used for natural gas conversion and purchase of a new gas appliance. Incentives are in the form of rebates and up to \$1300 is available per property consisting of conversion costs (up to \$800) and purchase of a gas appliance (up to \$500). This rebate will be available after proof of connecting to natural gas.

The Conversion rebate may be used for:


- The cost of converting appliances to natural gas,
- Installation of a new or extending the fitting line,
- The additional cost that may be applicable for a service line (the pipe that runs from the gas main in the street to the gas meter on your property).

The appliance rebate may be used to assist with the upgrade or purchase of a new natural gas appliance to replace those appliances that cannot be converted to natural gas. (To find out whether your appliances can be converted to natural gas, you should contact a gas fitter, who can give you an independent assessment.) Rebate form refer to www.multinetgas.com.au.

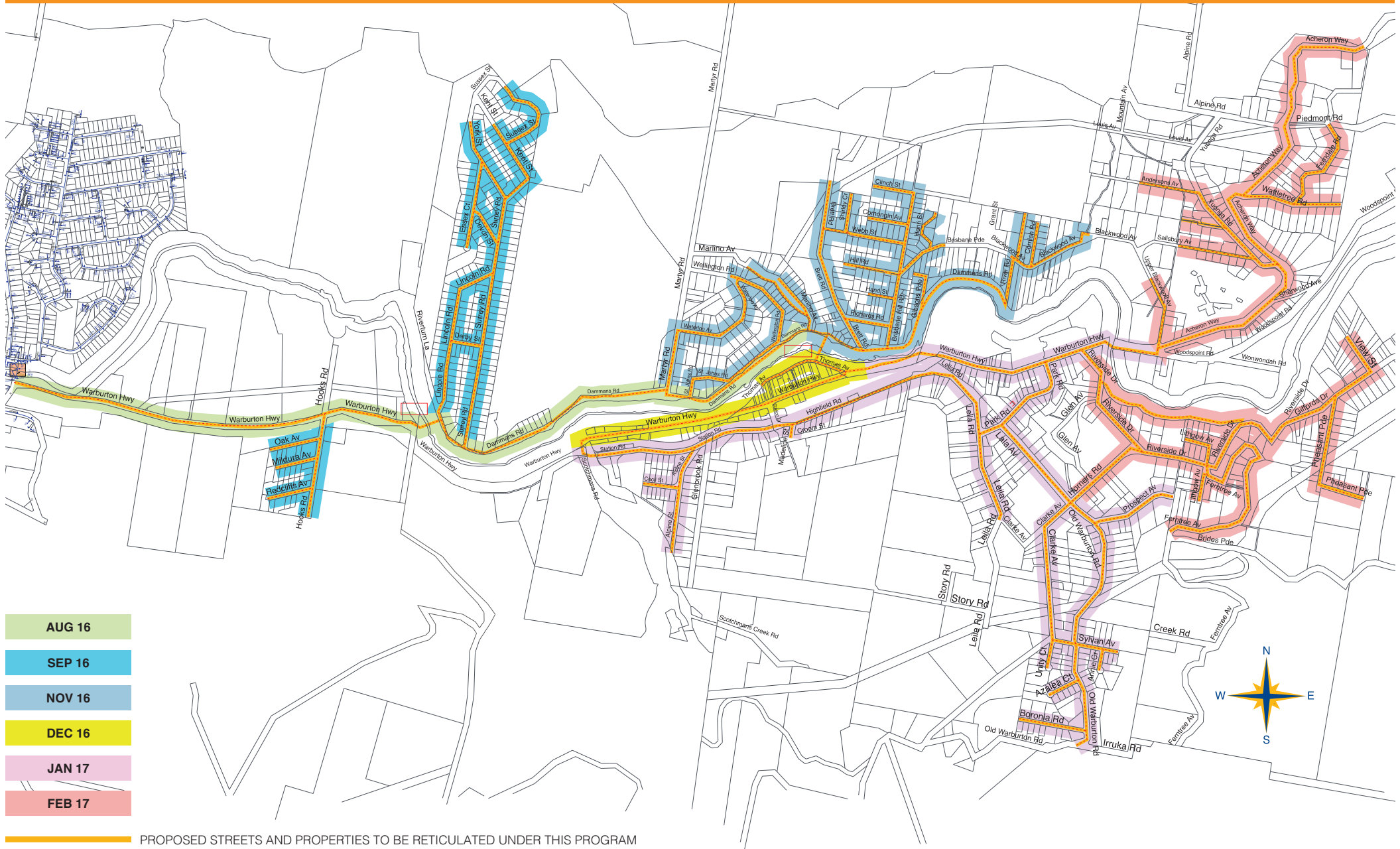
Upcoming work
